

Your Generics & Biosimilars Industry

The **Association for Accessible Medicines** (AAM) is looking to hire a **Summer Intern** to support our Sciences & Regulatory Affairs team. The internship will be four days per week, working on-site each Tuesday/ Wednesday and remotely on Monday/Thursday. Responsibilities include research and analysis of legislation and FDA regulatory process pertaining to the access of generic drug and biosimilars products. Attention will be focused on the history of regulatory acts and their impact today.

Job Responsibilities:

- Research the Generic Drug User Fee Act/Amendments and Biosimilar User Fee Act/Amendments for key points and provide summary and analysis.
- Provide support on sciences and regulatory affairs projects through the creation of PowerPoint slides, summary reports, talking points, etc.

Minimum Requirements:

- Rising junior or senior enrolled in a health policy related major, or recent graduate
- Strong interest in health or public policy, science background preferred

Desired Skills:

- Strong interpersonal skills, exhibits a positive attitude and a professional demeanor
- Strong written and oral communication skills
- Fluent computer skills, including use of Microsoft Word, Excel and PowerPoint and the willingness to learn other software tools
- Ability to work in a team environment and accomplish tasks with self-direction
- Ability to follow schedules and meet deadlines
- Ability to prioritize and manage multiple initiatives simultaneously
- Ability to conduct research using online sources
- Strong organizational and project management skills with attention to detail

The successful candidate for this position must have the ability to meet deadlines, work independently and collaboratively, and possess a strong work ethic. A minimum of 32 hours per week is required and the internship will last approximately 8 weeks, starting in early June 2024. This internship pays \$17.50/hour and is not eligible for benefits.
